

WHY WE LOVE HIM: Like a renaissance man, Kipnishasmastereddisciplinesrangingfromarts tosciences. Yetinnewagestyle, hisoeuvretends to all things green. His penchant to build fant astical Legoedifices and fully-wired wooden forts led him to choose architecture as a profession before 10. But when the oilembargo hit in 1973, "I realized our resources are limited and we're all going to have to buy into energy conscious design." That's when he knew he wanted to specializeingreendesign, though the rewas no nameforityet.Butsemanticsdidn'tstandinhis way;todayKipniscanwaxpoeticonenvironmentallysoundtechnology, science, design, politics, values and sports—not to mention his still stellar skateboarding. "Onagoodday, Icancranknine old-skool 360's," he says gleefully.

WHAT HE HAS DONE: Kipnis was in the vanguard when he enrolled in the University ofColoradoatBoulderforitsenvironmentaldesign program, then went to Arizona State for a Master of Architecture in energy conscious design. And true to his calling, he's made green design his priority eversince he began practicing in 1985. "At first I'd be lucky to do one green project a year," headmits. But Mayor Daley's 1999 Green Homes for Chicago initiative gave sustainable buildingakick-start; Kipnis designed one of the fivehomesselectedtobebuiltandhasbeengoing full-tiltwithgreenworkeversince. His projects haveearnedhighEnergyStarratingsandspreads innationalsheltermagazines, including Renovation Style, Better Homes & Gardens, Coastal Living and Natural Home.
